### Airline Update

- British Airways now offers Woolworths food and beverages. Customers flying economy class on domestic and Southern Africa regional flights are in for a pleasant surprise at meal times, when served with Woolworths goodies on-board, from BA'S 'Café Cloud' menu, as well as Woolworths delicious tea and coffee (from the middle of September).
- ETIHAD Airways will boost its Indian network with the launch of non-stop flights from Abu Dhabi to Hyderabad in November. The service will initially operate four times a week until the beginning of 2010 when it will increase to daily. Etihad will operate a two-class A320 on the route, configured with 20 seats in Business class and 120 in economy class.
- We are now able to book Kulula's full inventory on Galileo, thanks to a new deal between the low-cost carrier and GDS' parent company Travelport.
- Kenya Airways has announced that its Mombasa schedule will increase from 27 to 58 flights a week from Nairobi. Flights will be operated by a B767-300ER, which carries up to 250 passengers, to serve the high-frequency Mombasa route on Wednesdays and weekends, depending on demand.

### Hotel Update

- Lagoon Beach Hotel and Spa has announced that its management agreement with the Three Cities Group has come to an end, and that the hotel will now be independently managed. The Three Cities Group will, however, still be involved in a joint sales effort.
- The Don Group, in partnership with Always On and Internet Solutions, has announced the availability of Always On wireless Internet access at all Don Suite Hotels countrywide. The Wi-Fi connection and access will be available anywhere in the hotel, and not only at designated points and open areas.
